We have had several confirmed cases of Covid across the school in the past week.

We are no longer required to close bubbles or inform parents of confirmed cases throughout the school. NHS Track and Trace will contact close contacts. However, we thought it was important to share this with you as you may wish to be extra vigilant if your child becomes unwell.

In order to avoid reintroducing additional measures, we would kindly ask that parents exercise caution and ensure that if children are unwell, Covid is ruled out before they return to school.

We understand the frustration parents may have in relation to events such as parents evening being run remotely, however, our main priority is keep keep the school fully open allowing all children to access face to face teaching and we hope you support this priority.

We are planning to run open afternoons across the school towards the end of the spring term to allow parents a chance to see their childrens work and spend time inside building. We will keep this under review but this is our aim, Covid permitting.

This week children in Key Stage 2 have taken part in 'Quick Sticks Hockey' at the Westgate center. This was a training session for our pupils and they learnt how to pass in hockey, how to use their skills to score against an opposing team and how to play a match. This was a great introduction to the sport and throughly enjoyed by all.

We also had a group of pupils from Years 5 and 6 attend a 'Future Flyers' sporting event with 18 other local schools. This involved a fitness assessment that included rowing, cycling and running. Pupils had to run an army style obscale course which included various fitness challenges. The children that participated were a credit to the school.

Year 1 have been enjoying carrying out practical science investigations about the properties of everyday materials. They have explored which materials float and sink and which materials are opaque, translucent and transparent. The children have been learning how to make sensible predictions and how to record their observations in a table format.
