In the Year R classroom they have been making starfish linking to their topic of under the sea. "We used different printers and rollers to make different patterns" - Hector.








WHAT YEAR 1 HAVE BEEN UP TO THIS TERM!

Alien Day


Recently in Year 5, a spooky-out-of-this-world event was held. While walking into school, lots of crazy, unique creatures from space were spotted in Year 5

Summer Term

We have had a very busy term, as we have reported back in our weekly newsletters, but it is a pleasure to share some of the highlights with you again in the magazine.

As well as our usual PE lessons delivered by Mrs Dutton and our class teachers, we have had cricket coaching for the whole of Key Stage 2 from "Chance To Shine" cricket. Our Reception class had a series of dance lessons led by R'n'B Dance. Y1s had tennis lessons from Justin at Chichester Racquets and Fitness Club. Our Years 4 & 5 have continued with their swimming lessons, with all of the children given the opportunity to swim in t-shirt and shorts and develop their water safety skills. Year 6 also received a session playing baseball with the Chichester Falcons! And, of course, we had our whole school sports day - watched and supported by many parents and grandparents.





On the 26th May, we split our Year 6s into 3 teams and they participated in the Quadkids Athletics competition at Bishop Luffa School.

In their teams, the children scored points competing in the 75m sprint, the 600m run, the standing ling jump and throwing a Vortex Howler. Our "Team 2" came 5th out of the 19 teams competing (taken from 14 schools).

Ariana secured 3rd place overall amongst the girls with an impressive individual score of 193!

We decided that instead of taking one team of 10, that we would take the whole class of 30 when Year 2 went to the Westgate Centre to take part in the Infant Commonwealth Games in June.

Despite the heat, the children really enjoyed the opportunity to take part in this festival of sport, inspired by the events making up the Commonwealth Games, and be amongst the 240 children at this venue. The children reported back that they had had lots of fun and liked trying the new activities.

We were delighted to be one of only six schools in the Chichester area to be invited to take part in the Cormorants' Swimming Gala in June.

This year we didn't have any Years 6's taking part, and so our oldest children were Year 5 and they swam against some large and powerful swimmers. The Chichester Falcons ran a competition at Oaklands Park and so we went down and played 2 8-minute inning games against Kingsham Primary and West Dean Primary School. We played each school twice. Although we came third, the children had lots of fun and really threw themselves into it. One of our boys – Sam – joined West Dean to play as they were a child short (unless they were playing us). 


For ages 6-8 and up OLD ENOUGH TO SAVE THE PLANET
