## **LEGO Day**

January 28th is International LEGO Day each year. It celebrates the day that the first patent for the globally famous interlocking plastic brick was submitted in Denmark, the home country of the LEGO brick. Friends of JYS thought that this was worth celebrating and so have thought of some activities for **Friday 26th January** that your child can participate in if they wish, these include:

- **Design a LEGO Mini-figure**. This can be completed on paper (blanks have been sent home with children today and attached to the email) or could be a model created from your own LEGO. These can be entered into a competition for an entry fee of £1 with a selection of Lego prizes up for grabs!
- **Brick tower** if people have any spare or odd LEGO bricks at home, please send them in with your child on the day. Each brick will be added to a tower. Let us see how high we can make it? Once the tower is finished with, the LEGO will be broken into sets for classes to use in school.
- **LEGO landmarks** if you would like to, using LEGO, create an iconic local landmark (e.g. Cathedral, The Cross, Spinnaker Tower), take a photo of your creation and email it into school. These will be put up on display in the library with the best ones being shared in the school magazine.
