### **Health and Safety at School**

A few reminders as we move in to the Spring Term. Please do not cycle, scoot or skateboard on the school grounds (adults or children). If you are cycling or scooting to school, we continue to advise that you wear a helmet for your protection. Dogs are not allowed on the school grounds at all (even being carried). Last week, Year 6 were joined by Paul Ullson to begin our new history focus - The Changing Power of Monarchy. The children were introduced to every single monarch since 1066 and were able to interview many significant monarchs including William the Conqueror. They were able to examine a variety of artefacts associated with different eras of monarchy. This week they have been learning how to divide fractions. They also led an assembly on Tuesday morning where they shared book recommendations with Key Stage 2. Six children from Year 5 were selected to attend a conference on Wednesday afternoon to become "Bronze Ambassadors". They join the six children (who are now in Year 6) who did the training last year as sports leaders at the school, and will work with Mr Neaves and Mrs Dutton to promote sport and find opportunities to encourage all children to be more active.

Years 3 and 4 have had their second dance sessions with Rachael Royce from R'n'B Dance - and as ever it is fantastic that we can allow all of the children in the school to have access to this high-level of dance provision.

Year 2 have been learning how to write descriptions of people in Literacy, whilst in Year 1 in Science they had fun investigating "The Frozen Men"!
